I once heard that "Gardening is a performing art…the slowest performing art", and I'd have to say that in my first year as Executive Director at Heathcote Botanical Gardens, there are some things that respond rapidly, while others do so relatively slower. Personally, I lean toward the rapid, but I'm learning that in any good garden, both are worth the wait.

As we closed out our fiscal year September 30, 2023, having planted, watered, and cultivated many things here at Heathcote both plants or relationships, I'd like to share with you some of what took root last year and likewise, seeds that will be sown in 2024. ### **GIFT SHOP**

We found that the gift shop had sustained considerable termite damage despite our best efforts to keep the building pest free. It took several months of appointments and strategy sessions to find a contractor to remediate the problem in conjunction with the pest control company. We undertook a financial campaign to cover the costs we'd incur and to our delight, you contributed nearly \$40,000 and it looks like we'll be able to start renovations in April. Thank you to those who contributed.
